Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan
(5th September, 1888 to 17th April, 1975)

Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was an Indian philosopher and Politian who served as the first Vice President of India (1952-1962) and the second President (1962-1967) afterwards.

Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was born on September 5, 1888 in Tiruttani, Tamil Nadu. He was born to a Telugu-sepaking Niyogi Brahmin family. Radhakrishnan was awarded various scholarships throughout his student life in Tirupati and Vellore. He, then pursued Philosophy at the Christian College Madras. Radhakrishnan attempted to bring eastern and western ideas together, defending Hindusim against uninformed western criticism. Radhakrishnan was awarded Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award of India, in 1954.

Every year, Teacher's Day is celebrated to mark the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, the greatest teacher and scholar of India.

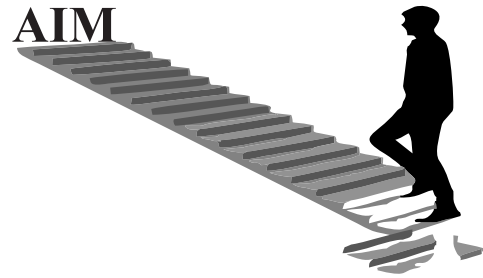
Tanvi:- What are the qualifications required for these courses?

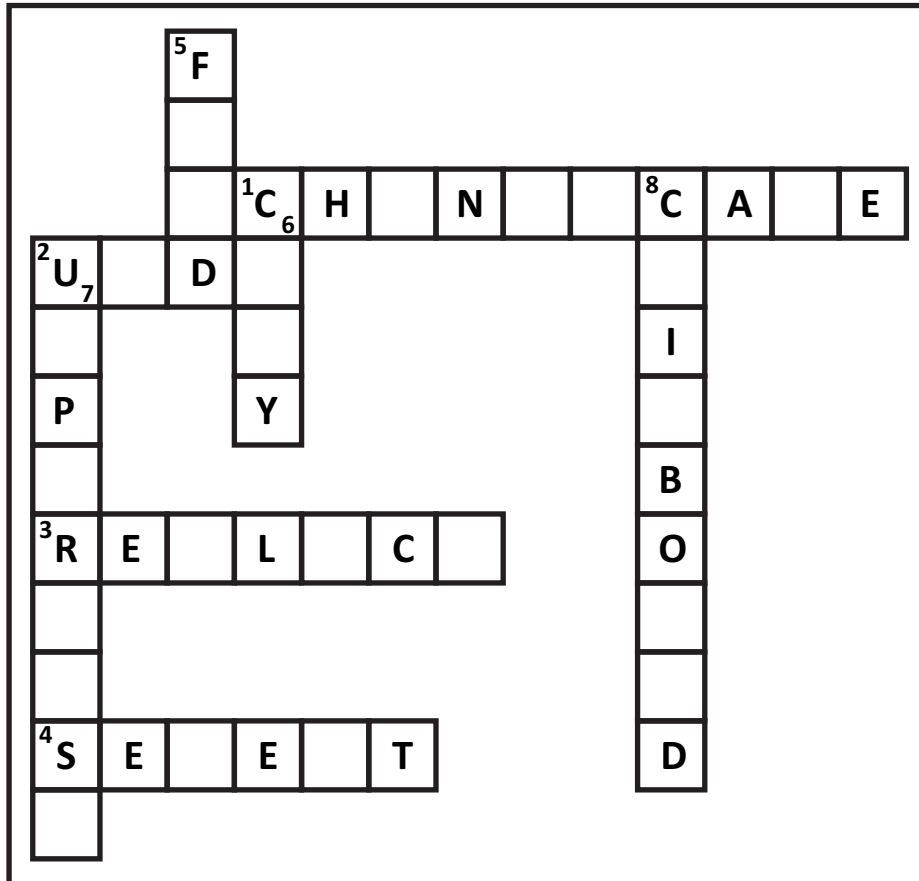

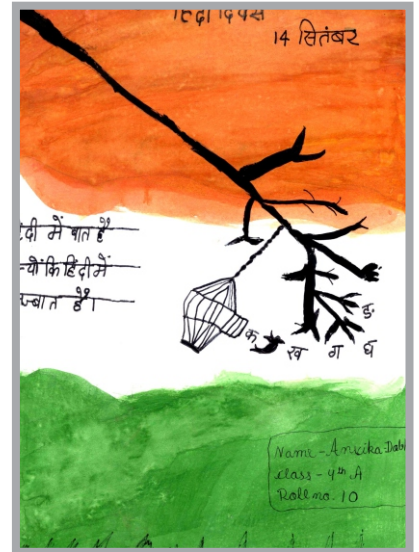

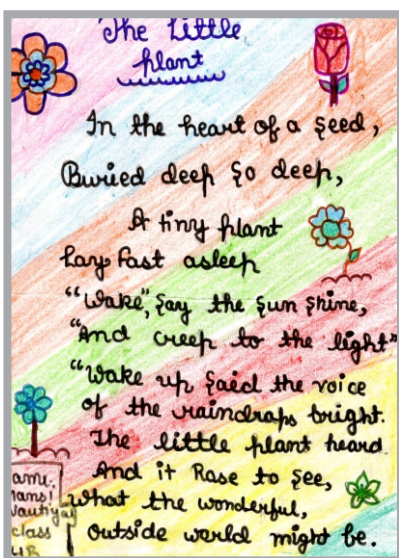

The Valley of Flowers is one of the most beautiful places in the Uttarakhand for tourism. It is situated in the upper expansion of Bhyundar Ganga near Joshimath. The valley of flowers, also known as Phoolon ki Ghati in Uttarakhand covers an expansive area of 87 sq.km. It was founded by the British mountaineer Francis Frank & his wife, Mythe. In July 2005, it was added to the list of world Heritage sites by UNESCO.



This site is the major attraction for nature and adventure lovers. It has 300 species of flora. The flora includes species of Lilies, Poppy, Brahmakamal, River anemone and many more. It is also the home of endangered species like snow Leopard, Black Bear. The valley also contains the species of birds like Himalayan Golden Eagle, Griffon Vulture, Himalayan Snowcock and many more.



The host of butterflies also contributed to the colourful scenery of this valley. It flowers bloom from July and goes for 3 to 4 month and the rest of the month it is covered with snow. People and tourists from all over the world come to see its exotic creation of flora and fauna. It is believed that Lord HanumanI had brought Sanjeevani from the valley of flowers for the ailing Lord Laxman to cure him. of t have a special place in the heart of people who are in search of beauty and nature.

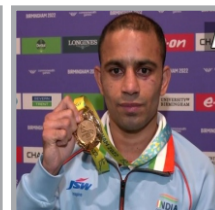
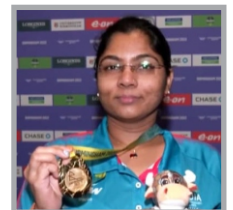
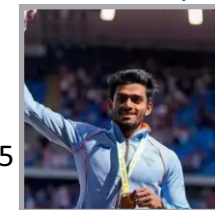
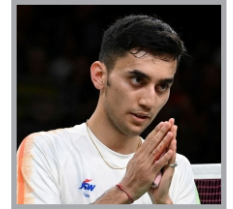
